ACCIDENT CHECKLIST / TO DO'S

Determine if medical assistance is necessary and if necessary, call 911.

Cooperate fully with police and/or first responders.

Determine any immediate hazards / Move yourself or others out of road.

Determine the identity of all people involved in the accident and vehicles.

Photograph/measure skid marks, property damage, debris, etc.

Ask witnesses to the accident for their names, addresses and telephone numbers.

(do not assume the police or others will do this for you)

Place In Glove Compartment With Insurance.



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ACCIDENT CHECKLIST: WHAT NOT TO DO

Do not make any statements other than directly to the police officer.

Do not refuse medical treatment when there is any possibility you may seek medical treatment in the future.

Do not argue with other drivers / involved in the accident or witnesses who may have been there.

Do not give any statements to any insurance company, adjusters or third parties who call you on the telephone.

Do not sign any paperwork other than what is required by the investigating police officer (IMPORTANT).

Do not assume that you did not lose consciousness when discussing to the emergency room physicians unless you are absolutely sure. For example, if you were feeling dazed or have any moment of black out or memory loss, be sure this is reported to the emergency room physician and nurses.
